**Implementation of the Idea Submission Form and the Idea Register**

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**PRESENTER**

**SUMMARY**

Staff has continued development of the Idea Register ("Register") and incorporated the revisions the Board requested to the draft Idea Submission Form ("Form") following previous discussions and is ready to implement them if directed to do so by the Board. This report details the options staff has created for the public to submit the Form as well as outlines the procedures staff will implement to follow up with submitters. Staff has also continued developing the Idea Register Summary Report that will be posted to the website for the public to track the status of their submissions and for the Board to reference. Staff recommends that the Board direct it to continue development on the Idea Register and publish the Idea Submission Form and Idea Register Summary Report for public use.

**STRATEGIC PLAN**

2020 Strategic Objective: Continue Building a Foundation for Board Operations

Strategic Activity: Enhance Strategic and Annual Planning Through the Creation of an Idea Register

**BACKGROUND**

At the January 13, 2020 meeting, the Board discussed the draft Strategic Plan and the ability to account for and track the ideas and possibilities for Board action by means of an Idea Register. During its February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020 meeting, the Board discussed the draft Idea Submission Form that interested members of the public may utilize to enter possible ideas for Board action into the Register and provided feedback for staff to incorporate.

## DISCUSSION

Staff collected the comments from Board from the February 2020 meeting and completed a comprehensive set of revisions to the Form including:

- The ability to submit a partially completed form
- Fully fillable PDF functionality
- Terminological changes to the title of “concern”
- Inclusion of a question on Government Code 4216
- Inclusion of a question on the Strategic Direction that best aligns with the idea
- The option for attachments if the provided space is insufficient
- Clarification of language in the “Background” section
- Consolidation of duplicative questions
- Addition of a reference number
- Additional instructions for contributors

The updated Form is a fully fillable PDF that would be available for download from the Board website at: <https://www.disgsafe.fire.ca.gov/idea-register>. The Form includes general instructions for completion and submission by email, mail, or returning a physical copy to staff at events such as Board meetings. A list of detailed instructions would also be available on the site to help the public best understand how to use the form.

After a contributor fills out the Form and sends it to the Board, staff will respond in an email with a confirmation of receipt of the submission. The confirmation email will include a reference number the contributor may use to track their idea within the Register.

Staff will process the information contained within the Form by adding it to a database staff has created to contain the Register data. Any blank answers on the Form will be input as blanks for that particular field. Staff will generate an Idea Register Summary Report from the information in the database that will be posted to the website and updated on a regular basis. The Idea Register Summary Report will include a summary of each submission and basic categorical details such as Strategic Direction of the idea, date of the submission, reference number, and the name of the contributor.

When the Board reaches the annual planning phase, staff will generate an Idea Register Detail Report that contains the full information received via Form submissions for the Board to consider for potential action and prioritization. If the Board selects an idea for inclusion in the annual plan, staff will email the contributor an update notifying them of this status change. When a meeting date is set for discussion on a topic from the Register, staff will email the contributor should they wish to attend and provide public comment.

At any point, if the Board wants to follow-up with a contributor, it may do so if the contributor provided their complete contact information on the Form.

Staff plans to include the Register, Form, and the processes for utilizing them as part of future outreach efforts as a way to grow stakeholder involvement in the Board’s mission.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff seeks Board concurrence in posting the Idea Submission Form and the Idea Register Summary Report to the Board's website.
