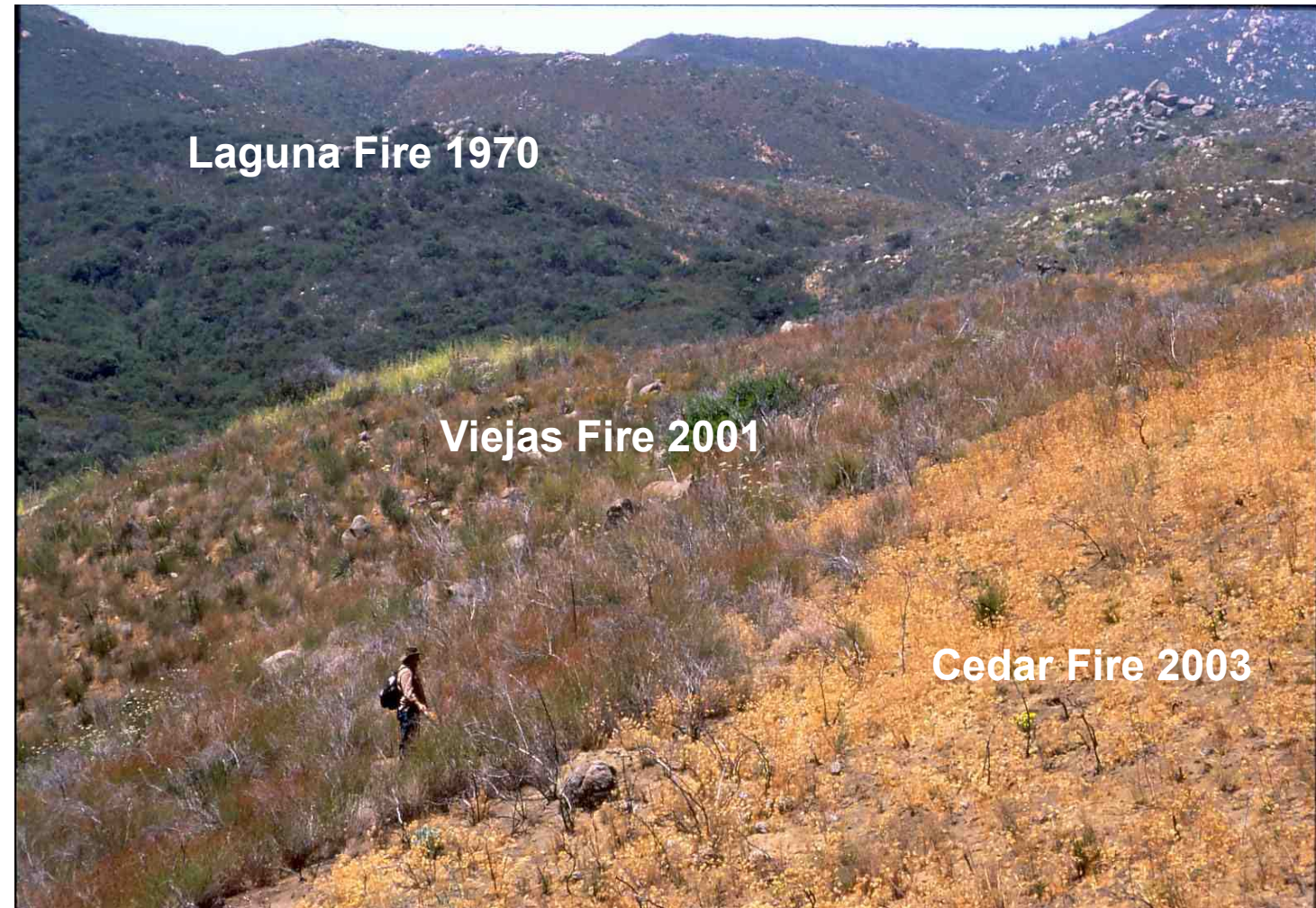
- 501(c)3 Non-Profit
- Manage 30,000 Acres of Public Land in Partnership with OC Parks, Irvine and Newport Beach
- Conduct Habitat Restoration and Enhancement on 1,500+ acres with Mitigation Funding
- Build and Maintain 160 Miles of Trails and Visitor Infrastructure
- 525 Volunteers Annually Give 50,000 hours and Provide 2,900 Public Programs



Wildfire in the South Coast



- Shrublands - Different Fire Regime than Forests
- Wind-Dominated vs. Fuel-Dominated
- Region Has Had **Too Much Fire**
- Natural Fire Return Interval = 70-150 yrs
- Current Return = 7-10 yrs
- Increasingly Catastrophic Fires



Wildfire in the South Coast



- 90% of Acres/Property Damage in Only 10% of Fires = Leverage
- Almost 100% Human-Caused
- Driven by Strong Seasonal Winds – 18 to 24 days/year
- Embers Spread up to 5 Miles
- Nearly Impossible to Suppress with Conventional Methods



Communities at Risk



In Orange County Alone:

- 90,000 People Evacuated in 2020
- Almost Entire County Vulnerable
- Thousands of Aging Structures at High Risk from Embers
- Smoke and Health Hazards for Entire Region
- Hundreds of Fuel Mod Zones Requiring Maintenance

Investments in Land Protection Threatened

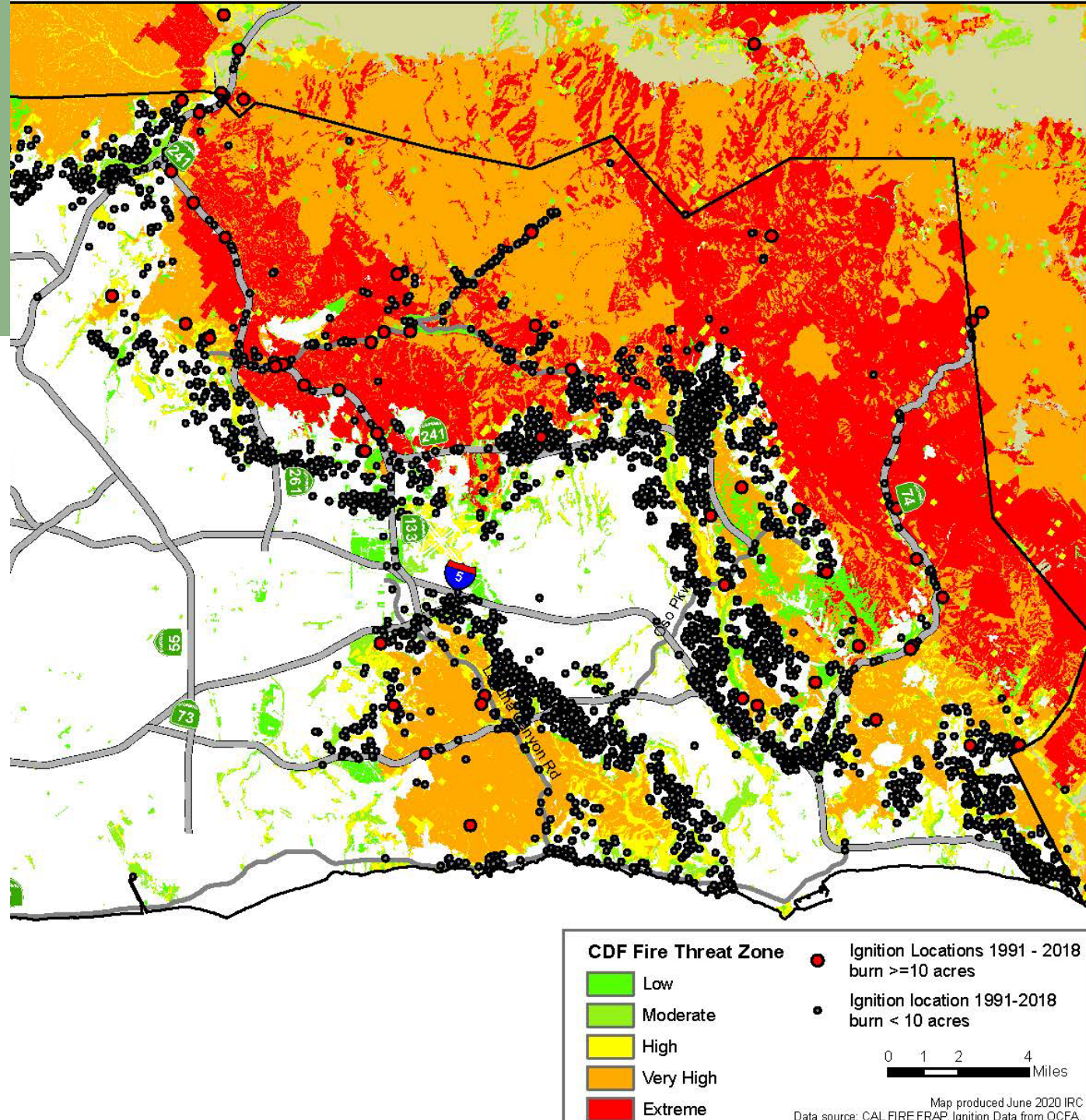


In Orange County Alone:

- 60,000 Acres Protected Since 1980
- \$100+ Million in Public and Private Funds Spent
- 120+ Rare Species and Natural Communities
- Critical Urban Wildlands for Nature and People

Unconventional Responses Needed

1. Ignition Prevention (93% Start on Roadways and Powerlines)
 2. Structure Resilience – Defensible Space & Embers
 3. Strategic Fuel Modification Zones
- Landscape-Scale Fuel Treatment **Makes the Problem Worse**



COAST Fire Prevention Working Group



- Recognition that Wildfire is a Shared Problem
- Shared Response to Wildland Fire Prevention and Risk Reduction
- Convened by OCFA in 2014
- Developed Orange County CWPP
- Established AlertWildfire Cameras
- Identified New Coastal Weather Zone
- Coordinate Ignition Prevention and Risk Reduction Programs
- Expanding through Regional Forest and Fire Capacity Program (RFFC)

- 🔥 Santa Ana Wind Events (Red Flag Warnings)
- 🔥 Ignition Prevention on Primary Roadways & Utility Infrastructure
- 🔥 Arson Deterrence
- 🔥 Structure Hardening
